BELARUSIAN STATE UNIVERSITY

Memorandum of understanding was signed between BSU and Airlangga University (Indonesia)

The Memorandum of understanding was signed by the rectors of universities **Andrei Karol** and **Mohammad Nasikh.** This is the first document regulating the interaction of a Belarusian university with Indonesia. According to the memorandum, academic exchanges, joint educational and research projects, consultations, conferences, seminars, symposia, exchange of scientific and methodological materials will be organised. The first step in the implementation of the official agreements will be the participation of BSU teachers in the DECOTA educational programme. It is focused on attracting renowned scholars to deliver online lectures to students at the University of Airlangga. In addition, BSU students were offered free training on the online programme "Sura-Bali Community Immersion Programme 2020" from 16 to 27 November. It involves the study of Indonesian culture and tourism activities in the provinces of East Java and Bali. The training was organised by Airlangga University in cooperation with Petra Christian University and Udayana University.

RIGA TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY

In Latvia, a special robot for fight with COVID-19 will be created

In cooperation with representatives of Riga Technical University and several other higher education and research organisations, a special cleaning robot is being created in Latvia, with the help of which it will be possible to disinfect various surfaces, thus fighting COVID-19. It is planned to demonstrate the robot at RTU in about a month. The new robot is based on a cleaning robot, which was created with the great investment of Latvian scientists and is already used for cleaning floors in airports and hospitals. Scientists are now adding new features. The aim is to develop a robot add-on that would allow automatic disinfection of rooms and various vertical surfaces, such as doors, door handles, windows, etc.

The researcher at the University of Latvia is developing a study on the possibilities of creating an effective innovation ecosystem in the Baltic States

Prof. **Ilona Baumane-Vītoliņa** conducts a study on the possibilities of creating an effective innovation ecosystem in the Baltic States. She presented the research idea at the "LU New Technologies and Innovations Day". The aim of the research is to find out the necessary preconditions for the creation of a sustainable innovation ecosystem in the Baltic States and to offer new organisational forms for the promotion of successful cooperation between all parties involved in the creation of innovation. The post-doctoral study "Opportunities for Creating an Effective Innovation Ecosystem in the Baltic States" analyses the current situation in the practice of cooperation between the public, private sector and research institutions, as well as compares it with what is happening in neighboring countries. In addition, the study analyses the experience of several European countries in creating and maintaining an innovation ecosystem. The second part of the study focuses on the analysis of innovation capacity in the SME sector, while the last part looks at specific initiatives that promote opportunities for cooperation between the state, research institutions and the private sector.

HERZEN STATE PEDAGOGICAL UNIVERSITY OF RUSSIA

The year 2020 has become a record year for Herzen University in terms of the number of foreign students

This year, more than 1300 foreign citizens entered Herzen University for the first year of bachelor's and master's degrees. The enrollment of students from non-CIS countries has increased by almost 40% compared to the last year. These are representatives of 44 countries with China occupying the leading position. In addition, there is a sufficient number of students from Estonia, Vietnam, Latvia. The number of students from the CIS countries has remained fairly stable over the past three years: about 600 students; the largest number comes from Uzbekistan, Turkmenistan and Kazakhstan. The statistics on graduate school deserves special mention. In this difficult year, admission to graduate school increased by almost a third and amounted to 155 people.

An agreement on the creation of a scientific and educational consortium was signed. The activities of the resource centre will be aimed at implementing an educational programme focused on the production and power generation segments of solar energy. The second direction of the resource centre will be research activities in the field of photovoltaics, energy storage and hydrogen energy.

ST. PETERSBURG ELECTROTECHNICAL UNIVERSITY

Head of the Property Development Department **Vladimir Pavlovskikh**: "We are striving for modern campus standards"

In his interview to newspaper "Electrician", **Vladimir Pavlovskikh** told about the work done to modernise the infrastructure of ETU "LETI". For the first time in many years, the university sets itself ambitious goals for the commissioning of new infrastructure facilities: one more academic building, a dormitory and the longawaited "restart" of recreation centres for employees and students. It is planned to build a nine-storey building for educational purposes with an underground parking for 240 cars. In addition to classrooms and laboratories, it will provide areas for the placement of sports and cultural infrastructure, a technology park, as well as accommodation for foreign scientific and pedagogical workers. The new 324-bed dormitory and the existing building to be reconstructed will have a combined engineering infrastructure and a functionally compatible set of premises. As a result, the university will receive a new complex with a total area of 20 000 sq. m, designed for a comfortable stay of 1125 people, that meets international requirements. Currently, the university has two recreation centres. University Rector **Viktor Sheludko** set the task to restore the recreation centre near Kutuzovskoe village until 2023, where up to 80 employees can rest at the same time, and by 2030 build a new sports and recreation camp for students in Mesterjärvi. Campus is not only buildings, territory, structures, but also their functional content, competent organisation of space. That is why the management was tasked with organising the information space of the university campus. Sketches of constructions of information signs, signboards and stands in Russian and English were developed, their locations were determined. In the main building it is planned to create a joint educational and scientific centre with PJSC Gazprom. At the conference of workers and students of the university held in September, the rector **Viktor Sheludko** outlined the vectors of the university's development aimed at improving the educational and scientific process, supporting the social field, strengthening the material and technical base.

The Russian Science Foundation and the German Research Foundation (DFG) have summed up the results of the fifth joint grant competition for international research teams. Five of 18 winning projects will be implemented under the guidance of SPbU scientists – this is the best result among all participating organisations. Projects in the field of physics and mathematics, natural sciences and humanities received grants. Each research team includes scientists from Russia and Germany. An amount of 18 million rubles will be received by each project within three years, from 2021 to 2023.
