University of Latvia

On 24 September, a new Senate was elected at the Constitutional Assembly of the University of Latvia. At the meeting, LU Rector Indriķis Muižnieks introduced the amendments to the Law on Higher Education Institutions (entered into force on 16 August 2021) which include introduction of the typology of HEIs; establishment of HEI Councils, which envisages partial transfer of Senate's functions to the Councils and changes in the structure and adoption procedure of a HEI's Constitution.

The procedure for electing five representatives of the University Council and the rules for starting the operation of the University Council should be determined by 30 November. Draft regulations of the election commission of the Constitutional Assembly and the draft Constitution should be developed by 31 December.

The Chairman of the Senate Mārcis Auziņš emphasized that the work of the Senate during the last two years should be assessed as constructive. It included the election of the rector, licensing of study programmes, election of professors, appointment of programme directors, making changes and creation of new normative regulations, adoption of the budget and the new LU strategy. https://www.lu.lv/par-mums/lu-mediji/zinas/zina/t/67943/

In addition, over 120 candidates from Europe, Asia, Africa and South America started their Doctoral studies at GUT.

Yaroslav-The-Wise Novgorod State University

In order to promote internationalization, NovSU is going to open the third Englishlanguage programme in Medicine (Pharmacy) in 2022 in addition to the existing two: General Medicine and Dentistry. It is planned that 650 students will be trained in these areas. It should be noted that the number of international students increased by 41% in 2020. Yaroslav-The-Wise Novgorod State University

Ministry of Science and Higher Education of the Russian Federation selected 106 universities from 49 cities of Russia for the Priority 2030 programme. These institutions will receive the basic part of the grant in the amount of 100 mln rubles. **IKBFU, LETI, PskovSU, NovSU** are among these universities. Universities will also have opportunity to compete for the special part of the grant in the nearest future (awarded in in two areas: research and territorial leadership).
